Day 1 Unwind and end your day with a sunset DINNER cruise aboard the Nautica Queen

Day 2 Wake up to BREAKFAST and All aboard! Lolly the Trolley Tours, a unique sight seeing adventure about Cleveland's history, diverse architecture and ethnic neighborhoods. After all that fun, we head to Chicago "My Kind of Town" – check into your hotel, grab your walking shoes and hit the ground running to explore the city, heading straight to the top and see it from above! The Sears Tower Skydeck, offers exhibits on Chicago history and, of course, the best view in town. With your feet back on the ground its time for a slice of heaven, Chicago's famous style PIZZA. **Chosen best pizza in America!**

Day 3 After BREAKFAST, our group departs on a guided city tour to see such sights as sculptures by Picasso, the Hancock Skyscraper, the Magnificent Mile, Lincoln Park, views of Lake Michigan, and the biggest fountain in America. Day 5 Begin with BREAKFAST before meeting our step on guide. Really want to know how Pittsburgh became the "Steel Making Capitol of the World?" Visit the site of the historic Homestead Strike of 1892. Get up close with a steel mill and get to know titans of America's Industrial Age like Andrew Carnegie and Henry Clay Frick. It's a great way to really get to know what makes Pittsburgh such a fascinating city! Next, step back in time at the Frick Art and Historical Center. This restored estate of industrialist Henry Clay Frick features Clayton, a stunning turn of the century mansion, the Frick Art Museum and the historic car and carriage museum. After lunch (on own) our group will visit The Nationality Rooms at the University of Pittsburgh, a one of a kind attraction that defies description. Located in the inspiring Cathedral of Learning on the Pitt campus, each of the 26 classrooms reflects the culture and heritage of one of the area's diverse ethnic groups, and represents that nationality's contribution to the fabric of Pittsburgh. Enjoy your evening dining with our group for our farewell DINNER.

Day 6 Today we begin our journey home after BREAKFAST, bidding farewell to the people of Pittsburgh! Something to stop and see as we travel through the countryside is the Frank Lloyd Wright's Fallingwater, one of his most widely acclaimed works. The setting of the house is the waterfall over which it is built. There's lots of exciting attractions in this tour and we wouldn't want you missing all the adventure!
